Information about Seasonal Flu:

This year, seasonal flu vaccination must begin earlier than the usual mid-October through December time period. The novel H1N1 flu strain will be circulating at the same time. For most people, earlier seasonal flu vaccination will help prevent the possibility of getting both types of flu at about the same time. Seasonal flu vaccination will not provide protection from novel H1N1 influenza.

Seasonal flu vaccination is recommended for everyone 6 months of age and older, with certain groups being at a higher risk for complications from seasonal flu than others. These groups include people over age 50, people with certain medical conditions, such as renal disease, heart disease, chronic pulmonary conditions(including asthma), cardiovascular disease, diabetes, and anyone with an immunodeficiency due to disease or medication. Women who will be pregnant during the flu season, breastfeeding mothers, and children are also included.

Every year over 36,000 Americans die from complications related to seasonal flu. Protect yourself and your loved ones by getting vaccinated for seasonal flu once vaccine is available. The Central Connecticut Health District will receive its full order of seasonal flu vaccine and will run vaccination clinics as usual, beginning in September, for residents age 9 and older.

Information about Novel H1N1 Flu:

An H1N1 vaccine is being produced and will become available at a later date. As time goes on, it is expected there will be enough H1N1 vaccine available to vaccinate every person in the United States who wants to be vaccinated.
