






COVID-19




OVER THE PAST YEAR...

Between January 1, 2022 and December 31, 2022 CCHD's Health Educator, Betty Murphy, helped educate COVID-19 positive residents on quarantine and isolation protocols; answer questions regarding long COVID; and refer patients to a primary care provider (PCP) for COVID-19 follow-up. She assisted 536 residents living in the towns of Berlin, Newington, Rocky Hill and Wethersfield.










Central Connecticut Health District 2022 INFLUENZA VACCINATION CLINICS

TO HELP PREVENT SERIOUS ILLNESS AND DEATH DUE TO INFLUENZA.....

The Central Connecticut Health District held nine vaccination clinics during the month of October. Clinics were organized by our Emergency Preparedness Coordinator. Two clinics were held in each of the four towns: Wethersfield, Berlin, Rocky Hill and Newington. An additional pediatric clinic was held in the town of Newington.

SERTEMBER 2022 - DECEMBER 2022...

Our Public Health Nurse, Lisa Coakley, performed **120** Direct Observed Therapies since the initiation of CCHD's Tuberculosis (TB) program in September, 2022. CCHD monitors patients with Latent and Active TB. Our nurse makes sure patients with TB in our jurisdiction have access to healthcare, are getting proper medical treatment, serves as a liaison between the medical provider and the patient and ensures they are taking their medications as directed through Direct Observed Therapy (DOT). DOT is extremely important. If TB medications are not taken as directed, this increases the risk of multiple drug resistant TB (MDR). MDR is both dangerous and extremely costly.









Total Number of Steps Taken in Each Town

Rocky Hill was the TOWN earning the highest overall number of steps: 29,851,560.


Impact Award Plaque:

Date: June 28, 2022


Objective: To inform and educate residents about native tick-borne diseases; how to prevent tick bites: and how infections are treated.




Central Connecticut Health District STATE OPIOID RESPONSE GRANT

The SOR Grant Recovery Coach, Sara Piatti, has helped a total of 330 people experiencing addiction to opioids.




Number of Opioid Resources Provided






COMPLAINTS:
